He served in the Obama Administration from 2009-2011 on Secretary Clinton's Policy Planning Staff and was principal drafter of the Quadrennial Diplomacy and Development Review (QDDR), Secretary Clinton's hallmark foreign policy and institutional reform effort. He has written extensively in the fields of international law and institutions, with focus on international criminal and international economic law. His current research explores the impact of global power shifts.



Vincenzo Zeno-Zencovich

Full Professor of Comparative Law at Roma Tre University, School of Law

Prof. Vincenzo Zeno-Zencovich is chairman of the Italian Association of Comparative Law. He is editor or member of the editorial board of several important Italian law reviews and author, co-author or editor of over two dozen books. He has been a legal advisor to the Italian Government in the last two decades in all the telecoms tenders and auctions. As a practising lawyer he has successfully litigated in landmark cases in damages for defamation, consumer protection, tobacco litigation and liability of providers.
